
Buddies Day Out With Dolphins


Oxygen is also consumed when dead plants and animals decay in the ocean."

O buddy continues "Also dolphins are warm-blooded mammals and so it is easier for them to regulate their body temperature in any environment."




o buddy, "When dolphins travel so much, what do they eat and how they keep that food with them, I mean I don't see bags hanging around them." (both laughed together).
